A Word from our VP

This month I want again to continue on a few thoughts about handling risk in activities that include it, skiing and riding in particular. I suggested that prioritizing risks is a cornerstone of so-called 'Steep Life Protocols', a terrain management system that increases a skier's safety. Four key backcountry protocols to help us prioritize risk that I covered in the two last months were 1) Be physically and mentally ready, 2) Monitor weather, 3) Travel with a team mentality, and 4) Select practical equipment. Here are some more.

5) Evaluate surface snow conditions: How far and steep are you willing to go with difficult surface snow conditions (including firm snow) that could cause a slide-for-life onto objects below? Is it worth the risk?
6) Assess snow stability: Today's snow conditions help predict avalanches during future snow accumulation later in the season. Does the snow pack consistently support your weight? Does the snow feel like graphite when rubbed between your gloves? New snow doesn't usually adhere well to faceted snow, sun-crust, or hard snow. Upside down powder (soft snow under a wind-affected surface) generally has a high-risk fracture propagation potential. Identify aspects and elevations with recent avalanche activity. If activity is present only on certain elevations and aspects, then select a route or zone with copious apex routes and safe zones. If avalanche activity is widespread, don't go.

More next time, on identifying terrain hazards and the like.

This should be OK for conditions. Please **Sign-In** by **8:30am** each morning. Sign-in will be by the fireplace upstairs in the Main Lodge. Alpine will be selling **discount tickets** at a special kiosk near our Sign-in location.

Some of us know how racing has changed over the years. It used to be that racing took up most of the day on the mountain, but not anymore. The competition has become streamlined. There are reasons for this:

- Open League racing is organized by a highly experienced group.
- The ski resorts are much more experienced at putting on a race.
- There are fewer racers.
- Race classes are increased, making it easier to balance the groups that race together.

Those of us that have been racing for 10 or more years have seen this. Racing has improved in many ways:

- The race courses are longer than they used to be.
- The race courses are better groomed with fewer ruts.
- Even the intermediate racers get two runs sometimes.

For anyone who would like to **try racing**, come on up for a weekend. Anyone can try the racecourse for a small fee that can be applied to league registration. Just be there by 8AM. Or call me for more information at 925-828-8265 (H) or 925-549-1715 (C).

Other January races are at Squaw Valley, Jan 10 & 11 and January 24 and 25 at Alpine Meadows then Squaw Valley.

Included is the schedule for the upcoming race season. It is also on the website for **Open League**. Watch the Open League website for the latest information – see website below

Check Caltrans road conditions if we get a storm within 24 hours of your trip (1-800-427-7623). The roads are usually cleared 12 hours after the storm ends. Sometimes it just rains on the roads.

Races usually start at 9:30 AM or 10 AM. Early in the season, the league starts the 8-10's first, then the 5-7's (intermediates), then the 0-4's (advanced). Later in the ski season the starting-order changes.

Now that Colorado has legalized pot you can walk in, buy weed, and inhale it at your leisure. A potential problem with this new law has yet to be determined, but there's one place where it's still illegal to smoke it—at ski resorts.

If you get caught by authorities toking while skiing or snowboarding, you **WILL** get busted! Nearly all of the 21 ski resorts in Colorado are on Federal land. Weed is still an illegal drug, according to Federal law. Plus, it's still illegal to smoke in public in Colorado. Federal law of course trumps state law. But in 'legal' states, it's no longer a state crime to possess pot. The Feds can still close down dispensaries if they wish, or bust anyone for driving across state lines where marijuana is still illegal. But the gradual trend is definitely in the direction of national legalization.

Colorado snow sport enthusiasts certainly favor legalization. In resort towns like Aspen and Vail, nearly 75 percent of voters voted to legalize recreational pot. Even though it's against the law to smoke on resort property, that law is ignored by many. It's just too easy to slip into the trees at the sides of runs and have a smoke. As long as snow sport enthusiasts are being discrete, there's very little chance of getting caught.

Legalizing marijuana in Colorado maybe a real problem for the ski resorts in straight-laced Utah, which is in a constant rivalry with Colorado for resort customers. Will Utah lose some of their lucrative share of the multi-billion annual resort business to those who prefer to visit a state where they can legally purchase pot and discretely smoke it while on the slopes?

Even more to the point, how much revenue will Utah earn by posting more police at the state line to bust—and fine—those they think are flying or driving into Utah while concealing legally purchased pot that suddenly becomes illegal when leaving Colorado?

Don't take when you hit the slopes! Or if you do, be careful!
